

## THE ONLY THING FOR CERTAIN IS "CHANGE"

There continues to be a great flurry of activity within the State among agencies such as Dawn of Hope related to completion of the Centers for Medicaid/ Medicare Services (CMS) rule changes for Medicaid Waiver Services. You may recall in previous letters I have referred to the new required focus on Community Based Services.

All providers have now completed their self-evaluation surveys assessing community inclusiveness and for those areas not in compliance – a transition



plan has been submitted and approved by Tenncare. However there continues to be confusion as to the level or degree of facility based service that will be permitted under the new rule.

As for Dawn of Hope, we have established a committee composed of Parents, Board members and Administrative staff to review and develop service options that will not only encourage community involvement, but will also bring the community into our facilities both at the Stratton Center as well as the Gump Vocational Center. The committee is anticipated to report to the Board of Directors in the early Spring and the State appears to be requiring full compliance by March 2019.

These requirements will likely bring drastic changes to services – including significant cost increases based on "current" rates. This could not come at a more critical time as agencies are experiencing critical staff shortages due to lower unemployment rates. The primary focus of our state association, Tennessee Community Organizations (TNCO) - representing some sixty-five agencies like Dawn of Hope, will be seeking a 5% rate increase in the upcoming State budget. This comes after less than 2% increase (total) in the past eleven years. This increase is desperately needed to insure continued quality of care for Tennessee's most vulnerable citizens.

Families of individuals served need to continue to ask questions and express preferences as to what types of services they wish to see in the future. Hopefully a compromise can be reached that provides opportunity for service recipients to fully experience the community, but yet also recognizes the substantial needs and preferences of some, and how facilities can be better utilized in the future.


