Your donations have helped us to provide these opportunities as well as developmental supplies, therapy equipment, medical supplies, essential



OLD DOG - NEW TRICKS

fter you have spent 31 years working at a place you think you have probably seen everything. Well that might be true as long as government is not involved. While we graciously appreciate the funding provided by the Federal and State Governments for our Medicaid Waiver programs – the hoop jumping required for that funding often not only gets tedious – it gets intensive! Such is the case currently.



All agencies across the state, like Dawn of Hope, are experiencing some of the most drastic changes to programs and funding we have EVER seen since Medicaid began funding such services back in the 1980's. Currently agencies are making program transition plans and changes to comply with the Federal Settings rule which requires that service recipients have full access to the community.

In just a few months – a new waiver program – Employment, Community, First or ECF, will be the new Waiver that serves all new admissions to service. The focus will be on employment for individuals served. However one of the major changes for providers will be a new relationship in billing and payment as we contract with the State's Managed Care Organizations instead of TennCare or the State Department serving intellectual disabilities.

These are only the two major issues confronting providers today. Internally, most providers are struggling to retain staff as service rates have been basically stagnant for 12 years and providers have not been able to provide competitive wages. A budget amendment has been proposed to address the issue – which the outcome might be known by press time.

Overall – it's a lot for anyone to keep up with – and there are some days – I do feel like the proverbial "Old Dog".
